

FMBG Annual Report July 2024 to June 2025

On behalf of the FMBG Committee I have pleasure in presenting the annual report for the Friends of the Melton Botanic Garden (FMBG). This report covers the period 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025.

Firstly, a big thank you to everyone who helps and supports FMBG. We have a wonderful and dedicated group of FMBG volunteers committed to volunteering and working hard. It has been another year of achievements and progress in developing, enhancing and maintaining the Melton Botanic Garden (MBG).

FMBG Meetings

We had a variety of guest speakers and topics for our meetings in 2024/25. The monthly meeting raffle was well supported, as we raised \$1,461. Thanks to Carlene Vukovic for organising and serving the supper for the meetings and those who assist, to Jill Bentley and Vee Beatty for the raffle, to Boro Vukovic and everyone who helps him set up and pack up, and to Barbara Frampton and Rob Stewart for opening and closing the venue.

Committee Meetings were held at the Brookfield Lifestyle facilities. Thanks to Mike Coveney for opening and closing the Brookfield meeting facility.

Membership

We achieved a membership total of 441 financial members on 30 June 2025 (previous year 444). Individual memberships were maintained at 414, the previous year was 415. It is positive to see us maintaining a strong financial membership base of over 400 individual members. We received support from businesses through corporate memberships and especially our sponsors Edible Eden Design and Newport Lakes Native Nursery.

Events

We held several new events during the year, we commenced nature sketching workshops at the garden, and, the nursery continued with their external sales events at Bacchus Marsh Flower and Garden Show, APS Geelong, and APS Melton and Bacchus Marsh.

Garden Development

Major areas in development include: 1) boardwalk area east with final toppings on paths, further planting and mulching; 2) further planting the Californian, Central and South American Garden; 3) replanting of some beds in the Mixed Garden Beds North; 4) redevelopment of the Western Australian and South Australian central beds; and 5) Sensory Garden informational plant signage.

We received funding from the Council budget of \$41,400 ex. GST, an increase on the previous year's amount as Council applied CPI. This funding is specifically to develop, enhance and maintain the garden. There are strict recording and reporting responsibilities we must comply with in expending public funds.

The volunteer hours in the table show we have contributed over 15,433 hours which is a decrease of 776 hours. The Centre for Volunteering Calculator values our contribution as \$724,734. We have not reported all the other activities we do as volunteers, such as: Committee Meetings, various other meetings, project management, collecting plants, external events e.g., presentations, fundraising activities, and all those activities our volunteers do in their own time to support FMBG and the garden. Many volunteers use their own vehicles and are covering their running costs in many of our activities and in the garden. We have many volunteers who purchase or donate items without re-imbursement to support FMBG and our activities. All these contributions demonstrate what a dedicated and committed team of volunteers we have in FMBG. Congratulations to everyone!

We continued our program for volunteers on required hours. Without their wonderful assistance across the garden and in administration we would have difficulty developing and maintaining the garden.

Thanks to Anne Langmaid, Nursery Manager, and the whole nursery team in managing the propagation and sale of plants. The nursery had its largest ever sales revenue of \$31,487 ex. GST. The sale of plants continues to be the major source of funds at 63% of total operational revenue.

Guided Tours and Visitors

We have led several tours for specific events, festivals and groups. We have deliberately restricted the number of tours so we can focus on the garden development. Many thanks to everyone who has led tours, assisted with the guided tours and associated morning teas or lunches.

Collections and Plant Recording

Jennifer Peters has diligently been entering plant records into IrisBG and producing reports. Many thanks to Jennifer for her precise and hard work on this continuing work and for conducting a training session for volunteers. Paula Willy, our admin assistant, has been learning some aspects of IrisBG. Paula undertook a project to enter the details and location of all the garden seats and picnic tables onto IrisBG together with a photo of each installation. Garden Explorer continues to be used by visitors and volunteers. We have continued to add more information about the plants and features to Garden Explorer.

Garden Furniture

The Odd Jobbers installed 5 recycled plastic seats and one picnic setting in the garden. We thank them for their work in enhancing the garden through the furniture installations. We receive many positive comments about the number of the seats and their locations through Facebook and Google reviews.

Community Involvement in the Garden

Kurunjang Secondary College 'Hands on Learning' students have continued working with the Lakers.

The Lakers commenced having 4 Melton Special School students working with them on Thursday mornings. These students are undertaking their TAFE Certificate II in Horticulture and gaining practical experience at the botanic garden.

Promotion

We continued our strong presence on social media and through our web page. FMBG and volunteers appeared in the Melton and Moorabool Star Weekly several times. The garden has been mentioned more by Council in its communications through printed material, social media, and the local newspaper.

Our patron, Jane Edmanson OAM, has been continuing to promote FMBG at events she attends and has visited the Friends and Melton Botanic Garden a couple of times during the year.

Presentations given to other groups focus on the development, existing gardens, and plants of the MBG. Thanks to Max Thompson who has commenced giving presentations to groups this year.
