Nursery extends hours

MELTON Botanic Garden's volunteer nursery has extended its opening hours to ensure green thumbs have what they need for

autumn planting.
Operated by a team of 10 volunteers, the nursery opened for short periods from late 2014, but a bumper year last year has seen demand for the service

And with all the money raised from sales at the nur-sery going back into the Mel-Botanic Garden.

gardeners are being urged to shop local. Nursery man-ager Margaret Cook said the plants sold at the nursery were all suited to growing in the region.

"The plants sold are main-ly Australian native plant species and our customers appreciate buying plants which do not require con-stant watering in order to thrive," Ms Cook said.

She said many of the plants were also grown in the Melton Botanic Garden. She said more volunteers

to help run the nursery were welcome. "Volunteers propagate plant cuttings, pot plants into larger pots, water the pots, label the plants, stake and trim the plants in pots, and some vol-unteers conduct sales."

The nursery, on the corner of Tullidge and Williams streets is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays and the second and fourth Sunday of

the month, 10am to 1pm.

Southern African Garden Kei Apple (Dovyalis caffra)

Dovyalis caffra is a small to medium-sized tree, native to southern Africa. Its distribution extends from the Kei River in the south, from which the common name derives, northwards along the eastern side of the continent to Tanzania. The ripe fruits are tasty, reminiscent of a small apple. Can used to make jams and preservatives. The Kei Apple is rare in Victoria

A Kei Apple (*Dovyalis caffra*) has been donated to the Melton Botanic Garden by Bendigo Botanic Gardens. We were also given other cuttings from various plants for the Southern African Garden. Brad Creme the Curator gave us a tour of the gardens. We also tasted some of the ripe fruits. Watch out though as the tree has 10cm long thorns and you can end up with yellow hands from the fruit.



Bird Survey at Botanic Garden

Just done this week's survey of the Botanic Garden and saw a White-necked Heron at the North Pond near the Depot. Didn't get any photos- flew off before I recognised what I was seeing. There were lots of cormorants- 4 Little Pied, 1 Little Black and 1 Great Cormorant. Have there been fish introduced into the lake? Lovely morning for a walk, cool, no wind.

Bats next to Botanic Garden

A colony of microbats has been discovered by Lyn Holdsworth in this hollow branch about 100 metres from Melton Botanic Garden. About 60 bats flew out when disturbed. The volume of mosquitoes and other insect eaten by these bats would be enormous! The bats here would probably hawk for insects among the trees along Toolern Creek. They would no doubt use the nearby Botanic Garden Lake for water as it is a little more than a 100 metres from the lake.





Consensus of opinion identifies them tentatively as Chocolate Wattled Bats.

Richard Akers of Melbourne Water suggests: 'Looks like they may be Chocolate Wattle Bats. Lightening up the picture they seem to have pug noses and conspicuous flaps of the inner ear. I'm far from an expert, so they could also be Little Forest Bats or another species. I've found a dead Chocolate Wattle Bat a few years ago further downstream on Toolern Creek, at the walking track along the Strathtulloh Woodland. Great to have more evidence of how important this creek is for wildlife, particularly older trees'
